Over the last year, UKRI has supported Sciencewise public dialogues on topics including climate adaptation, the future of flight, genome editing in farmed animals, biomass and BECCS and data stewardship.

The commissioners of these public dialogues have used the outcomes to inform research and policy thinking throughout the policy cycle, from strategy to implementation. They have found that when the public are included, the resulting approaches are more likely to land well with wider society and to deliver what is needed.

The recent reaffirmation of the UK's commitment to becoming a science superpower and driving economic growth, as declared by both the Prime Minister and Chancellor in early 2023, amplifies the potential impact of such exemplary practices.

Public dialogue provides in-depth insight into the views, concerns and aspirations of a reflective sample of the population. This allows decision makers to develop **research** and policy that resonates with public views.

Established in 2004, the programme has supported **70 dialogue projects** and helps to ensure research and policy is informed by the views and aspirations of the public.

The programme is led and funded by UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) and managed by Involve, the UK's leading public participation charity.
